### **Meet the Staff Night:**

On Thursday September 15 come and meet the teachers and staff of NRP and learn more about the school community. Representatives from many of the after school programs and school clubs, along with PAC itself will be there to answer your questions. To make the evening easier, food will be available to purchase (more details on that to follow). This is a fun event for all parents and students!

### **PAC Meeting/AGM:**

I know your first thought is....boring! Actually PAC meetings can be very useful and interesting. Since the PAC executives work hard behind the scenes this is our time to update you on what we have done. It is also a time when school administration can provide updates on what they are working on. We are very careful to keep all meetings to a maximum of 1 hour. Meetings are held the first Tuesday of the month from 6:30-7:30 in the School Library. This year we have also booked a few speakers to come in for Parent Education Nights. We will combine these talks with PAC meetings. We are excited as well this year that, at each PAC meeting, we will have Child Care. We hope, by doing this, that it frees more of you up to come to the meetings.

The AGM will be held on October 4th this year. This is when we as parents will vote in the new PAC Executives. We encourage every parent to come vote!

## **Nut and Dairy Aware School:**

This is VERY important. There are



a number of students in the school (staff as well), who have severe allergies to either Dairy, Peanuts or Tree Nuts (Cashews, Walnuts, Almonds, Pecans, Pine Nuts, Pistachios, Hazelnuts). Because of this, the school requests that you **DO NOT SEND LIQUID DAIRY (milk or yogurt), or ANY TYPE OF NUTS TO SCHOOL!** Let us all keep the children safe.



## PAC Run Lunch Program:

Last year we rolled out an optional 5 day/week lunch program. We have made a couple of adjustments and will be offering it again. We will be working with 3 caterers this year as we were last year. All of them follow the BC Health and Nutrition Guidelines. This year we have Calhoun`s (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday), Sushi Sushi (Tuesday and Wednesday) and Foodie Kids on Fridays.

At NRP we believe in being as sustainable as possible so all the caterers remove and recycle the containers that the food comes in. **We also ask that all kids provide their own utensils.** This not only is better for the environment but will reduce the cost for the PAC so we can use those funds for other things.

We will continue to offer the option to order one week at a time, although you are welcome to order as far in advance as you like.

The PAC run lunch program will start deliveries on Monday September 19th.

You can find more information in the PACkage that we will send home with each child the end of the first week of school.

## Dropping off/Picking Up:

Those of us who were at the school last year know that drop off and pick up times at the school can be a challenge. NRP has been set up as a "Walking School". This means all the students who are within the boundaries for the school should be able to walk. The PAC runs (thanks to Natalie) a Walking School Bus which services Wesbook and Hawthorn. We encourage parents to sign up (information will be available this week when you get the PACkage which will be sent home with your child).

We also <u>encourage children to ride their bikes to school.</u> There is plenty of parking space on both the K-5 and the middle school side. We would like to remind you that it is the law that all cyclists must wear a helmet.

Also we would like to remind you that once you are on school grounds you must get off your bike and walk it. <u>"No wheels on school grounds".</u> This is for the safety of all the children.

If you do need to drive to drop off or pick up, please remember that <u>parking is very limited and all parking spots are</u> <u>designed to have vehicles back in!</u>

## New Crosswalk on 16th and New Speed Limit:

As Most of you who live on South Campus likely know, the new crosswalk at Binning across to Hampton Place is not fully operational. The Provincial Government, who is in charge of 16th Avenue, has also reduced the speed limit from Blanca to Wesbrook Mall. It has been reduced from 70km/h to 50km/h. We would like to remind all families that it will likely take time for the drivers to become used to the new speed limit as well as the crosswalk. Please be extra careful crossing both Binning as well as the round about at Wesbrook Mall and 16th. Unfortunately not all vehicles stop appropriately for pedestrians.
