WHO DETERMINES WHAT IS TAUGHT IN THE CLASSROOM?

- The BC Ministry of Education sets the curriculum for all schools in British Columbia. Norma Rose Point follows the new BC Curriculum mandated by the BC government.
- Any school that receives funding from the government follows the BC Curriculum

ARE ALL SCHOOLS IN BC MANDATED TO TEACH THE SAME THINGS?

- All government funded public and private schools in British Columbia are required to follow the BC Curriculum. All K-9 schools are required to follow the new BC Curriculum. The new grade 10-12 curriculum will follow shortly.

IF GRADE K-9 IS USING A "NEW" CURRICULUM, WHAT WILL HAPPEN WITH GRADE 10-12??

- This is the second year that the K-9 Curriculum has been rolled out on an optional basis for schools Province wide.
- The Grade 10-12 New Curriculum is optional use in the 2017/18 school year. It should be in full implementation for the 2018/19 school year.
