- Csilla asked about the status of the Lunch Receivables

- Pac2Pac Fund

Staff Report - Mike and Karen

- Student Led Conferences coming up March 7 & 8.
 - This is an organized conference where the child will take you through a series of activities, providing a snapshot of what their days look like and illustrating evidence of growth.
 - Teachers will be present to chat with as well.
 - Julie W. asked if Mike or Karen could give us any tips on optimizing the Student Led Conference.
 - You want your child to talk about their thinking process
 - It's about process and taking ownership.
 - Ask what's next, ask about their goals, their mistakes, their struggles, what they are going to do to move forward.
 - Ask questions that are open-ended as opposed to yes/no questions.
 - For example, instead of asking "Did you like X?" you could ask "What did you like most about X?" and you are likely to get a more thoughtful answer with more information.
- Staffing Update
 - Grade 7 teacher Jim Embry accepted a VP position with a January start date.
 - A Grade 7 retired teacher has stepped in to cover this position through spring break.
 - This position has been posted both internally and on the provincial external Make a Future website, and they are hoping to hire someone for this position.
 - Staff are working together through this difficult situation.
 - NRP is lucky to have the learning support that they do, as not every VSB school has this kind of support.
 - The VSB is still looking for quality teachers that have been vetted, not just teachers who are simply available.
 - The extra challenge with this Grade 7 position is that it is a temporary position, and those on the job market are looking for permanent positions so they are reluctant to take a temporary one.
 - Several parents attended this PAC meeting to voice their concern over the Grade 7 teacher situation.
 - If there are any issues, the protocol is to first speak to the teacher, and then if there is no resolution, speak to the Principal and Vice Principal.
