School Parking: A few things to know before driving:

There are limited parking stalls for parents in the visitor parking lot. While all families are encouraged to walk to school we understand that that is simply not possible for all.

- I. Very important to note that in the **Visitor parking lot cars must BACK IN.** Although it may seem odd, it is designed this way so, as you drive out, you have clear visibility if all little bodies that may be around.
- 2. If you are parking, please make sure you go to the office and sign in with your license plate number.
- 3. If you are **picking up or dropping off in front of the main doors** please know that you may not park and get out of the vehicle. This area is a drop off zone only. Also please be courteous and ensure you move up so you do not block traffic behind you.



4. You will see several parking spots in the Visitor Lot with this sign. **Please DO NOT PARK IN OR BLOCK these spots** unless you have authorization to be there. We have a few families in the school who require access to these spots.

5. Most importantly, please **WATCH YOUR SPEED!** There will be 700+ kids ranging in age from 5-13 in and around the school. We must always remember that their safety is the priority.



Walk or Roll to School:

Ideally, since we all live in such an amazing small community, we would like to see kids walking to and from school. The community has a Walk n Roll Program (see the PACkage that we will send home the first week of school for more details).

I. For those sending their kids to school on bikes please remember it is the law in **BC** that everyone must wear a helmet!

- **2.** Once on school property please be sure to dismount and walk the bike. This is to prevent any accidents.
- 3. There are several **places to park** and lock your bikes at school. There is one area to the west of the main school doors. That one is generally for kids in the lower grades (k-3). For those in Grade 4-7 please use the racks closer to the staff parking lot. This will ensure enough room for everyone!

Nut Aware School:

At NRP there are a number of children with life threatening allergies. The most common are Peanuts and Tree Nuts. We ask that **ABSOLUTELY NO NUTS** be brought into the school or onto school grounds. This includes peanut butter, other nut butters, Nutella, or any dairy products made from nuts like Cashew milk.

The PAC lunch program only uses caterers that provide nut free foods so anything ordered through there will be safe for all children with nut allergies.

Again this is about keeping all of our children safe at school.



What is PAC and how can YOU Participate?

Communication:

Communication is a priority for PAC and the school. The best way to ensure you receive important information and updates is to **Download the NRP App.**

This is where you can find information,

the school calendar, contact information for your child's teacher, and the Absence Form which you need to fill out if your child will not be at school. You can also find a Counselling Request form. This can be used by you or your child to privately communicate to the school counsellor if any help is needed. <u>The NRP App will also be the communication tool used by the school in case of any emergency!</u>

NRP PAC Lunch Program:

One part of the PAC is to help raise funds for items the school needs but is not covered by the government. Examples are computers, gym equipment, sports equipment for outside recess and lunch play, and musical instruments.

NRP PAC has been running an optional lunch program for the past number of years, The caterers are vetted through the PAC Executives as well as VSB to ensure they meet all the necessary health and safety guidelines. Our philosophy is to attempt to offer a wide range of foods that are as healthy as we can get. Obviously nothing beats homemade food but we hope for those parents who do not have time to prepare lunches that this is a good option.

We also strive to keep costs as low as possible. NRP PAC makes approximately 10% on each item which, over the school year adds up. On average PAC raises \$20,000 per year just off of our lunch program. All that money goes back to our kids.
