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Wednesday, September 18, 2019 Administrator Report (Ian and Teena)

- 1. All classes are now settled, we are currently enrolling 777 students in 32 divisions. The school has waitlists for some grades. All teachers have been hired, we are waiting for 2 School Support staff to be placed at NRP. Replacing Ms. Abbey Bell on September 30 will be former NRP Grade 6 teacher Ms. DeRosa.
- 2. Student Activities for term 1 cross country and soccer teams are in the organizational stage and we are waiting for schedules. School sponsored after school activities include Dance Team and Coding. Private rentals include Mad Science and Young Rembrandts. We are working with the Community Schools Team, who are looking to schedule yoga and art classes, a babysitting course and a first aid course as after school activities.
- 3. Student drop off and pick up Safety patrol will trained Sept.25 by the VPD and active that day. I am very worried that due to the parent traffic we will eventually have an accident where a student is injured. As well, Ortona road is impassible at times due to parked cars. Solutions must be found and practices must be changed. Parents may park in the day care drop off zones.
- 4. Reverse lunch hour Has been successful so far, students and have been eating more of their lunch are not rushing to eat then go outside as before. The primary classes have grade 7 lunch buddies to assist in their rooms while eating, the grade 6 students have been assisting the Kindergarten classes.

- 5. Student Lunch Drop Off Adults are reminded to bring student lunches into the office. The lunches will be delivered by staff and office monitors. It is very difficult for us to monitor adults on the playground, for the sake of student safety please drop the lunches at the office. The students begin eating at 12:30 pm.
- 6. School Goal our main goal this year is building a stronger school community and a sense of belonging with students.
