2. APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS PAC MEETING MINUTES ON APRIL 19, 2022

3. NRP STAFF REPORT - HENRY PETERS

- Thank you; it is good to be back. Apologies for missing the last PAC meeting. Spring Break to June is a race to the finish line it is very busy.
- Grateful to be on Musqueam land and that NRP is situated in such a beautiful environment. Most notable is how NRP students enjoy exploring and fort building in the forest.
- Every year or every second year, together with UBC, Grade 4 and 7 does a survey called the MDI (Middle Years Development Instrument). This is a self-reported questionnaire that looks at broader relationships and wellness. It is trying to develop a picture of what Grade 7s are like in the NRP community and also all across Vancouver.
- One of the first things of notice is that 48% of Grade 7s report have low well-being. The District average which surveyed 3000 Grade 7 students is at 49%. This number is concerning. Is this reflective of 2.5 years of the pandemic? Perhaps there needs to be a level of sensitivity to these group of students. This also emphasizes the importance of going outside as part of daily school activity and to have unstructured exploration time.
 - Importance of play. Block some negative media that may be coming their way.
- Thank you to PAC for supporting NRP financially and through collaboration.
- NRP will be adding another Division next school year, from 31 to 32 Divisions. There is a big demand at NRP and neighbouring schools and not enough space for families moving into the community. Next year, there will be 100 Kindergarten students which is consistent with this year; every year this group of 100 students moves up and an additional Division is required to accommodate this movement of students. More staffing will be added.
- Goal is to keep younger students together and older students together in the physical school building. There may be some communities or spaces where there are multi-grades together.
- Some teachers have expressed a greater interest in team teaching communities next year, so you may see groups of teachers opting to team teach an entire community. These will be ongoing discussions.

- There has been mixed feedback about alternative school calendars. There could be future discussions about a dual track calendar school, this could be something to consider in terms of innovation in teaching and learning. There is no proposal for such a calendar at this time, just a suggestion for innovation.
- NRP is in talks with a school board in Saskatchewan that has 9 Cree immersion schools about how to incorporate learning in Indigenous first language at NRP via Zoom or team calls (like a pen pal relationship).
- There will be a few more events in June regarding communicating student learning.
- Welcome to Kindergarten will happen in person on June 1.
- Two documents have been sent out to all families: school calendar for next year with the early dismissal and school closure dates and school fees, activity fee has been raised by \$8.
- Health: NRP continues to monitor the school closely for health-related issues and has been lucky to be very healthy school. It has been a very active year for seasonal allergies. For a large school, we remain a healthy site. NRP still wrestles with staff absences and covering both teacher and support assignments. Thank you to families who are very accommodating in picking up their children who become sick at school.
- Thank you for the Classroom Learning Experience Fund that helps support field trips and brining in specialists.
- Thank you for supporting the Indigenous Focus: playground and play space, upgrades to the Indigenous garden and outdoor space.
- ASK: iPads in many of the communities are very old and many are unable to access the internet. NRP is need of new iPads throughout the communities and is currently looking at ways of replacing them one community at a time.
- Sports Day is in discussions. More information will be provided shortly.

Q+A

Q: Do you have any statistics from previous years pre-pandemic? Is the 49% higher or lower than pre-pandemic, because what I remember in the past was that it was also considered concerningly high?

A: I don't have this data at the moment. NRP should be able to find previous NRP and District survey data. Ms. Burke has referenced that there were concerns about this number pre-pandemic but perhaps this number wasn't as high. Sleep, diet and wellness were a concern even prior to Mr. Cannon's arrival.

Q: Is Sports Day for parents as well?A: Not sure. We will keep you informed.

4. MOTION TO CHANGE THE DATE OF THE PAC ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING FROM OCTOBER TO JUNE STARTING 2023

- PAC AGM elects new executive members every year.
