Q+A

Q: What is the plan for filling staff vacancies before September?

A: First and round of post and fill just went out. All staffing will be in place as it stands right now for August, even by the end of June.

Q: Are there any activities that were halted during COVID coming back next year now that things are opening up?

A: Cautious as we open back up but educational conferences and activities will certainly be going back to what you remember pre-Covid. It mostly hinges on if there is staff available to volunteer their time to run the activity.

Q: Do you have any idea how the split classes look like next year?

A: Outside of Kindergarten which is a standalone class, there are mostly combined classes. The large population of K's moving up through the school creates very full divisions. Even with the addition of a 32nd division, NRP is still very full.

Q: How many *new* students next year? Are there plans to integrate these students with current divisions?

A: Registration is closed now. NRP already has a waitlist. In September, current students return to their previous teacher. New students go to the learning commons. New students are integrated with their age appropriate peers as soon as possible so that they can start building friendships and relationships.

4. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

FINANCE REPORT – TANIYA AMIRAJ

- (1) NRP PAC Main Account -
- Primary Fundraiser is the Lunch Program: \$19,000 raised. Thank you to the school for allowing the PAC to run the Lunch Program. Thank you to the parent volunteers and the student volunteers to help make this happen.
- Almost \$4,000 raised through other fundraised
- Budgeted to raise \$11,000 this year. As of June 2022, almost \$23,000 was raised.

Expenses:

- Administrative totalling \$580.
- Events: Primary event was the Staff Appreciation Lunches (three lunches instead of previous years' two lunches), Sports Day and Multi-Cultural Day totaled \$2,824.
- Supportive: Helping Hands, PPE, NRP Learning Communities totaled \$4,473.
- Total expenses: \$7,876. This is under the projected \$9,000 of expenses for the year.
- (2) Gaming Grant Funds provided by the BC Government to support extra-curricular activities
- Already in the account was \$34,000.
- Funds from this have already been earmarked for the Grade 7 graduation ceremony.
- There were not many funds needed for Clubs.
- Classroom Experience Fund was successful providing a lot of out of classroom experiences for NRP students: \$7,355 was spent.
- \$10,000 was earmarked for the Indigenous Garden, nothing has been spent yet. An additional \$5,000 will be set aside for the Indigenous Garden totaling \$15,000 after the motion has passed.
- To date, \$8,218 has been spent from the Gaming Grant, including the \$15,000 set aside for the Indigenous Garden.

INDIGENOUS GARDEN COMMITTEE - MICHELLE CHEONG + ATUL GADHIA

- The Committee is excited to announce that we have an NRP parent and Masters student at the School of Architecture and Landscape Architecture (SALA) who is in the process of joining the Committee as the main landscape designer of the garden, helping bring NRP's vision to life and coordinating the project.
- If all goes to plan, he will begin to work on the project over the summer providing renderings and budgets that will help facilitate the Committee's grant writing process in September which looks to match current funds (\$15,000 from the Gaming Grant + \$10,000 from NRP).
- In regards to budget, this project will be a long-term, multi-year, multi-faceted projected. It will likely begin with an Indigenous garden space, that eventually includes a long-house. The aim is to provide the school with an Indigenous garden, outdoor classroom, transition space between the forest and the indoor classroom, community learning space, and outdoor resource space.
- The Committees hope and goal is to take Mr. Peters's vision and create a rendering that will provide a sense of cost, budget, resources required, and staffing/volunteers work needed.
- This will be a multi-year project that parents, students and families can all feel involved in as it develops over the years in different stages and phases. This will be a community legacy piece.
- Indigenous consultants and community members will be key stakeholders in the Committee and consultation process as we build out the Indigenous Garden.
