3. NRP STAFF REPORT: Principal Henry Peters, Vice Principal Julia Clark

- Welcome. PAC helps the school in many ways, including funding for things such as field trips and learning resources.
- Approachable and accessible administrators; no appointments necessary. Feel free to come and talk to Mr. Peters.
- Personal digital devices from home must be turned off and put away during school hours. The school
 cannot be responsible for personal items. Digital devices are sometimes used for educational purposes
 in the classroom, as appropriate.
- Safe access to school act: Signs and protesters have to stay 20 meters from school grounds and activities for the safety of students.
- Family requests to modify the school day for individual students: Consequences to altering the schedule include inability of staff to report out or assess parts of that student's instruction.
- Curriculum and instruction: Assessment is communicated to parents via two informal conferences and three formal reports. Upcoming open house is an opportunity to informally communicate with teachers.
- Volunteer Conduct Agreement from VSB is to be used for everyone volunteering this year. The form
 outlines major VSB policies and a code of conduct for working with children. Privacy and confidentiality
 are to be maintained while volunteering; can reach out to teachers if needed.
- Late students must sign in and pick up a pink slip to give to their teacher so admin doesn't have to call parents.
